This is a time to reflect back on the remarkable progress our students have made since moving to KS4 during the Covid pandemic and the resilience shown with their learning and socialisation.

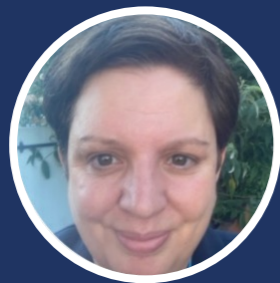
We are so proud of the fine young people they have become and look forward to celebrating with them at the Year 11 Prom in July and the Leavers assembly.

SAFEGUARDING

With the evenings getting much longer it is important to reinforce the following personal safety messages with young people who travel independently:

Always inform an adult where you are going and what time you will be back.

Ensure you always have your Oyster card, money, keys and a fully charged mobile phone with you before leaving the house.

Valuables should be kept out of site when travelling.

Sit downstairs on buses so you can seek help from the bus driver if required.

If you feel unsafe on the journey go into a public building and ask a member of staff for help. Staff working in locations displaying the Community Help Point Scheme sign have had special training on keeping young people safe.
