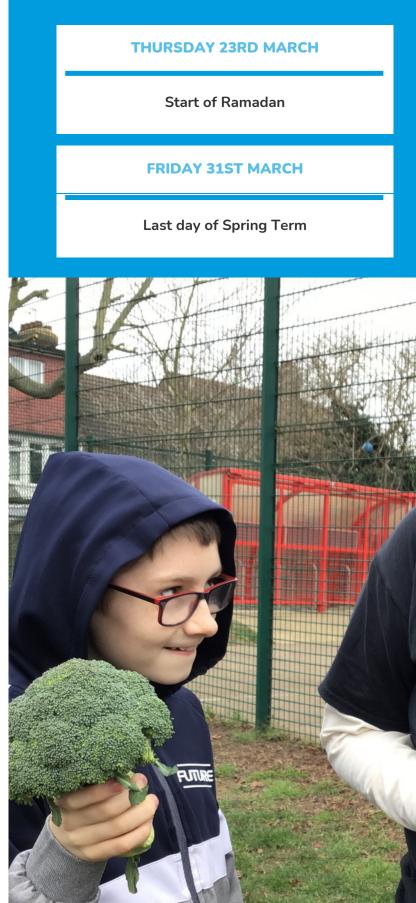
Safeguarding
